ECO NEWS FROM MRS COOPER



A big thank you to our Eco Leaders and supporting adults for all you have done to help the school raise awareness of the need to take care of our planet. This year we:

REMINDER: New National Framework Changes - Attendance

The paragraph below is taken from the new attendance guidance effective from August 2024 -

Two penalty notice limit and escalation in cases of repeat offences

190. A penalty notice is an out of court settlement which is intended to change behaviour without the need for criminal prosecution. If repeated penalty notices are being issued and they are not working to change behaviour they are unlikely to be the most appropriate tool. Therefore, from autumn term 2024, only 2 penalty notices can be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within a 3 year rolling period and any second notice within that period is charged at a higher rate:

- The first penalty notice issued to a parent in respect of a particular pupil will be charged at £160 if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.
- A second penalty notice issued to the same parent in respect of the same pupil is charged at a flat rate of £160 if paid within 28 days.
- A third penalty notice cannot be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within 3 years of the date of issue of the first.

In a case where the national threshold is met for a third time (or subsequent times) within those 3 years, alternative action should be taken instead. This will often include considering prosecution, but may include other tools such as one of the other attendance legal interventions.


Junior Kangaroo Challenge

Croydon Council's Family Hubs in Partnership with Surrey County Cricket Club will be delivering a free cricket programme over the summer holidays. Please can you cascade the information to your Parents and Carers.

Croydon Family Hubs would like to share an opportunity for children, aged 8 - 11 years, to participate in a short cricket programme during the school holidays. It will take place over 4 weeks - Tues 30/7/24, Tues 6/8/24, Tues 13/8/24, Tues 20/8/24.

We will be offering two sessions across the 4 weeks.

- Woodlands Family Hub, Farnborough Avenue, South Croydon CR2 8HD in the mornings. The morning session is from 10am 11.15am
- Thornton Heath rec, Winterbourne Road, Thornton Heath CR7 7QG. The afternoon session is from 3.00pm 4.15pm.

Places must be booked:

It would be beneficial if the children could attend all four sessions, either am or pm. Parents will need to drop off and pick up children (they do not need to stay but are welcome to if preferred) – please note that in the afternoons there will be no toilet facilities as it is being held in a public park.

The places are sponsored and run by Surrey County Cricket club and are free. The programme is predominantly aimed at low-income families although no families will be excluded.

Parents will need to complete their details on the link in the attachment (please note the parents need to complete their own personal details not the child's on the first step) – the next step is to add in the code on the attachment to make the course free. (Parents can add up to three children on one sign up).
